Sending Mail to an Inmate

There is daily incoming and outgoing mail Monday through Saturday. To write to an inmate the envelope should be addressed in the following format:

Inmate Name (include Jr., Sr., II, III etc.)

Please write a Return Address on the envelope in the event something needs to be returned to sender.

All letters must be sent and received via the US Mail. All incoming mail is opened, checked for contraband before being sent to the inmate population. Any incoming mail found to be in violation of the rules and regulations will be Returned to Sender, destroyed or placed in Inmate Property for access after release if no return address is present. Inmates are prohibited from corresponding by mail with any persons that are currently incarcerated without prior approval from the Warden of each Facility. Publications (paperback books or newspapers) will only be accepted if they are new from the publisher, inmates expecting a Publication are to notify Prison Staff of its expected delivery. Inmates are not permitted to have pornographic materials at any time while incarcerated. Polaroid photos will not be accepted into the Prison. Photos will not be accepted or permitted if the photo is too revealing. Colored drawings or paintings will not be accepted in the mail.
